The Arka Tech Wins Big

The Arka Tech won 26 awards, including five first-place awards, in Arkansas College Media Association competition. The awards were presented April 14 during the annual ACMA spring conference, hosted this year by Harding University.

Arka Tech Editor Johnan Mitchell won two first-place awards in headline writing. His "Suns Dry Out Blossoms" took first in online newspapers and "Hunter Gathers Followers" took first in the newspaper division. Mitchell also took second place in online headlines and in newspaper headlines, a second place in online feature writing and a third place in newspaper feature writing, and third place in online arts and entertainment writing.

Editorial writer Trinity Lisk won first place in newspaper editorials for her "We Want Jerry" editorial.

Radio manager A.J. Chauffe took first place in the podcast division for The Arka Tech Introspect weekly news program. hauffe also took second and third place honors in the podcasting competition, while Belin also took second place for her cartoon strip.

Cartoonist Madelyn Belin won first place for her "Sunny and Jerry the Bulldog" cartoon strip.

Lisk also won honorable mention recognition for online election and political writing.

Other staffers placing in competition included Editor-In-Chief Tara Espinoza who won second place in online sports photo and second in online spot news photo, third place, online meeting/speech coverage and honorable mention, online art/illustration.

Sports Editor Olivia Orr took second place honors and an honorable mention in newspaper sports column writing and contributor McKinzie Kyle won second place honors in both online arts and entertainment review writing and newspaper review writing.

Staff writer Cal Reeves won second place in newspaper general column writing, Anna Colby won third place in topical reporting and Doug Davis took third place in multimedia package.

Webmaster Avery Harrah won an honorable mention for best website.
